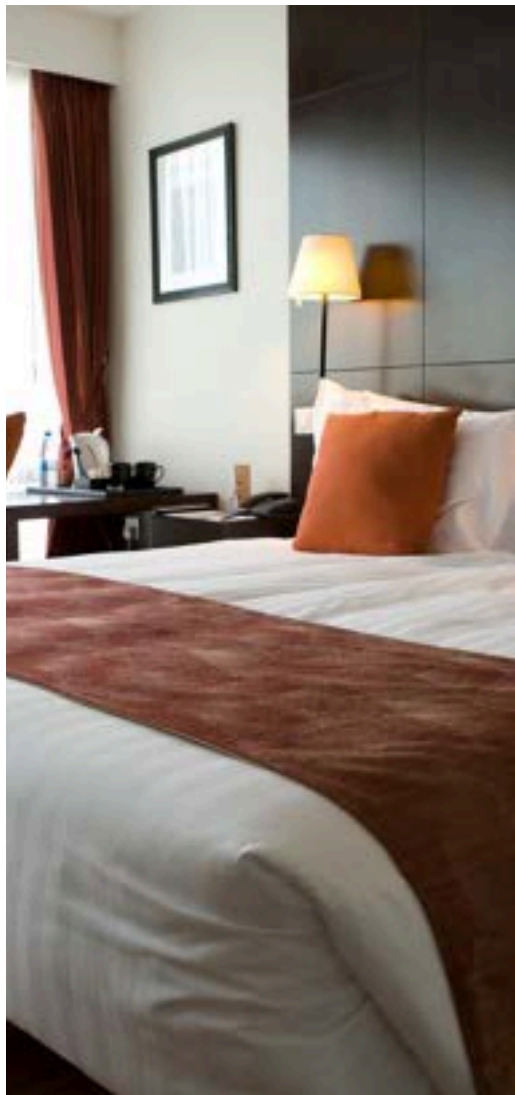

NORTHERN GREENLAND – AVANNAA - NORDGRØNLAND

BETWEEN EXTREME MARGINS, POLAR SCIENCE AND FRONTIER CULTURES

North Greenland is one of the last fringes of the inhabited world: a rarefied, luminous Arctic territory, where humanity coexists with the vastness of ice and silence. Villages like Qaanaaq, among the northernmost on the planet, are custodians of ancestral knowledge and ways of life adapted to the unimaginable. Here, the horizon is infinite and time slows to the point of becoming presence. Scientific bases like Station North coexist with isolated Inuit communities, offering a powerful dialogue between tradition, research, and survival. A radical place, destined for those seeking direct contact with the limits of human and environmental experience.

ACCESSIBILITY AND HOSPITALITY

Accessing Avannaa requires planning and openness to the unexpected. Connections are via special flights from Nuuk or Iceland, with a transit at Thule Air Base (Pituffik), followed by local flights or transfers by sled, helicopter, or icebreaker. Hospitality is rare, simple, yet significant: Inuit family homes, equipped polar camps, and research stations accessible upon request. In these extreme contexts, every form of hospitality is shared: of fire, of food, of storytelling. Relationships become part of the experience itself.

EXPERIENCES THAT INSPIRE AND UNITE

In Avannaa, the experience is extreme and transformative. It's possible to organize research residencies, anthropological field workshops, or immersive experiences with local communities based on observation, listening, and respectful interaction. Visits to Station Nord or remote settlements allow for a direct encounter with climate change, isolation, and human resilience. The glacial landscapes provide the backdrop for symbolic walks, reflective practices, and group activities that foster concentration and awareness. Nowhere else does silence speak so clearly.

THE IDEAL SEASONS FOR EVERY TYPE OF EVENT

- **Spring (May–June):** scientific missions, advanced educational trips, interdisciplinary training.
- **Summer (July–August):** academic expeditions, niche **MICE**, scientific residential programs.
- **Autumn (September):** research groups, experimental cultural initiatives, strategic **retreats**.
- **Winter (October–April):** specialized activities, long-term artistic/scientific residencies.



WEST GREENLAND – KITAA - VESTGRØNLAND

BETWEEN MOVING GLACIERS, INUIT CULTURES AND THE FRONTIERS OF ADAPTATION

West Greenland is the island's most vibrant and accessible region, where Inuit communities coexist with vibrant urban centers like Nuuk, Ilulissat, and Sisimiut. Deep fjords, floating icebergs, and colorful villages create a simple and powerful landscape, where every element speaks of resistance and adaptation. In this part of Greenland, climate change is tangible, intertwined with art, research, and memory. It is a land that stimulates critical thinking and a sense of limits, offering profound, ethical, and aesthetic experiences. A context that invites us to rethink our relationship with nature, time, and humanity.

ACCESSIBILITY AND HOSPITALITY

The main access is through Nuuk, connected by air to Copenhagen or Reykjavik. The tourist infrastructure, though basic, is high-quality and strongly characterizes the island: sustainable boutique hotels, local guesthouses, and wood-and-glass cultural centers overlooking the glacial sea. Nuuk hosts conference and meeting spaces, such as the Katuaq Cultural Centre, designed to host multicultural events. In Ilulissat, a UNESCO World Heritage site for its glacier, there are eco-lodges and workshop spaces immersed in the Arctic landscape.

EXPERIENCES THAT INSPIRE AND UNITE

In West Greenland, every activity becomes an act of observation and listening. You can participate in workshops with Inuit artisans, explore the fjords by kayak, or hike along glacial moraines with glaciologists and local guides. In Ilulissat, the Sermeq Kujalleq glacier offers one of the most intense experiences of the state of the planet. Sled or boat excursions among the icebergs become opportunities for team building and climate awareness. In Nuuk and Sisimiut, you can organize meetings with artists, archaeologists, and researchers, transforming your trip into a cultural and scientific laboratory.

THE IDEAL SEASONS FOR EVERY TYPE OF EVENT

- **Spring (April–June):** cultural **incentives** and study trips, academic **workshops** and educational residencies.
- **Summer (July–August):** experiential **retreats**, outdoor **team building**, nature-society training **events**.
- **Autumn (September–October):** seminars on sustainability and geopolitics, institutional trips, school programs.
- **Winter (November–March):** indoor **conferences**, strategic **retreats**, narrative **workshops** on Arctic culture and science.



EASTERN GREENLAND – TUNU - ØSTGRØNLAND

BETWEEN REMOTE GLACIERS, PRIMORDIAL IDENTITIES, AND GEOGRAPHY OF SILENCE

East Greenland is the most remote and mysterious part of the island: rugged, deep, and authentic, where the landscape dominates with its pristine majesty. Villages like Tasiilaq and Ittoqqortoormiit are outposts of humanity in vast, depopulated territories, surrounded by granite mountains, eternal glaciers, and the frozen sea. Here, every journey is a ritual and every encounter a vital discovery. Ideal for groups seeking direct contact with the essential: schools, researchers, artists, cultural travelers, and teams seeking depth. A place you don't visit: you walk through, listen, and embrace.

ACCESSIBILITY AND HOSPITALITY

Reaching East Greenland is already part of the experience. You arrive via Reykjavik (Iceland), with special flights to Kulusuk or Nerlerit Inaat, followed by transfers by helicopter or boat. The transportation network is limited but safe and well-coordinated. The small, family-run accommodations offer authentic hospitality: local guesthouses, wooden lodges overlooking the fjords, and base camps equipped for scientific or educational explorations. In Tasiilaq, the local cultural center offers spaces for meetings, exchanges, and performances related to Inuit culture and Arctic ecology.

EXPERIENCES THAT INSPIRE AND UNITE

In Tunu, travel is a slow and total immersion. Trekking among the glaciers of Sermilik Fjord, educational dog-sledding expeditions, or silent sailing among the icebergs of the Arctic Ocean are all possible. Encounters with local communities reveal a vibrant oral culture, made up of stories, crafts, and extreme adaptation. Experiences can include photography and art workshops, environmental listening sessions, guided reflections on the climate crisis, and group practices related to silence and resilience. Each activity fosters awareness and respect.

THE IDEAL SEASONS FOR EVERY TYPE OF EVENT

- **Spring (April–June):** educational expeditions, science projects, **team building**, trekking, and sailing.
- **Summer (July–August):** study trips, artistic residencies, cultural **retreats**, storytelling **workshops**.
- **Autumn (September–October):** reflective **workshops**, interdisciplinary training, international educational exchanges.
- **Winter (November–March):** creative **retreats**, indoor environmental observations, small academic groups.



SOUTH GREENLAND – KUJATAA - SUDGRØNLAND

BETWEEN ARCTIC PASTURES, VIKING HERITAGE AND RURAL REBIRTH

South Greenland is the greenest, mildest, and most historically stratified area of the island: here, the land below the Arctic Circle is cultivated, the memory of Norse settlements is preserved, and the relationship between humanity and landscape is renewed. Villages like Qaqortoq, Narsaq, and Narsarsuaq, along with the Viking site of Brattahlíð, tell a thousand-year-old story of adaptation and coexistence. The gentle mountains, navigable fjords, and cultivated valleys create a unique rural environment, where agriculture intertwines with archaeology and local culture. An ideal destination for those seeking a dialogue between past and future, nature and community.

ACCESSIBILITY AND HOSPITALITY

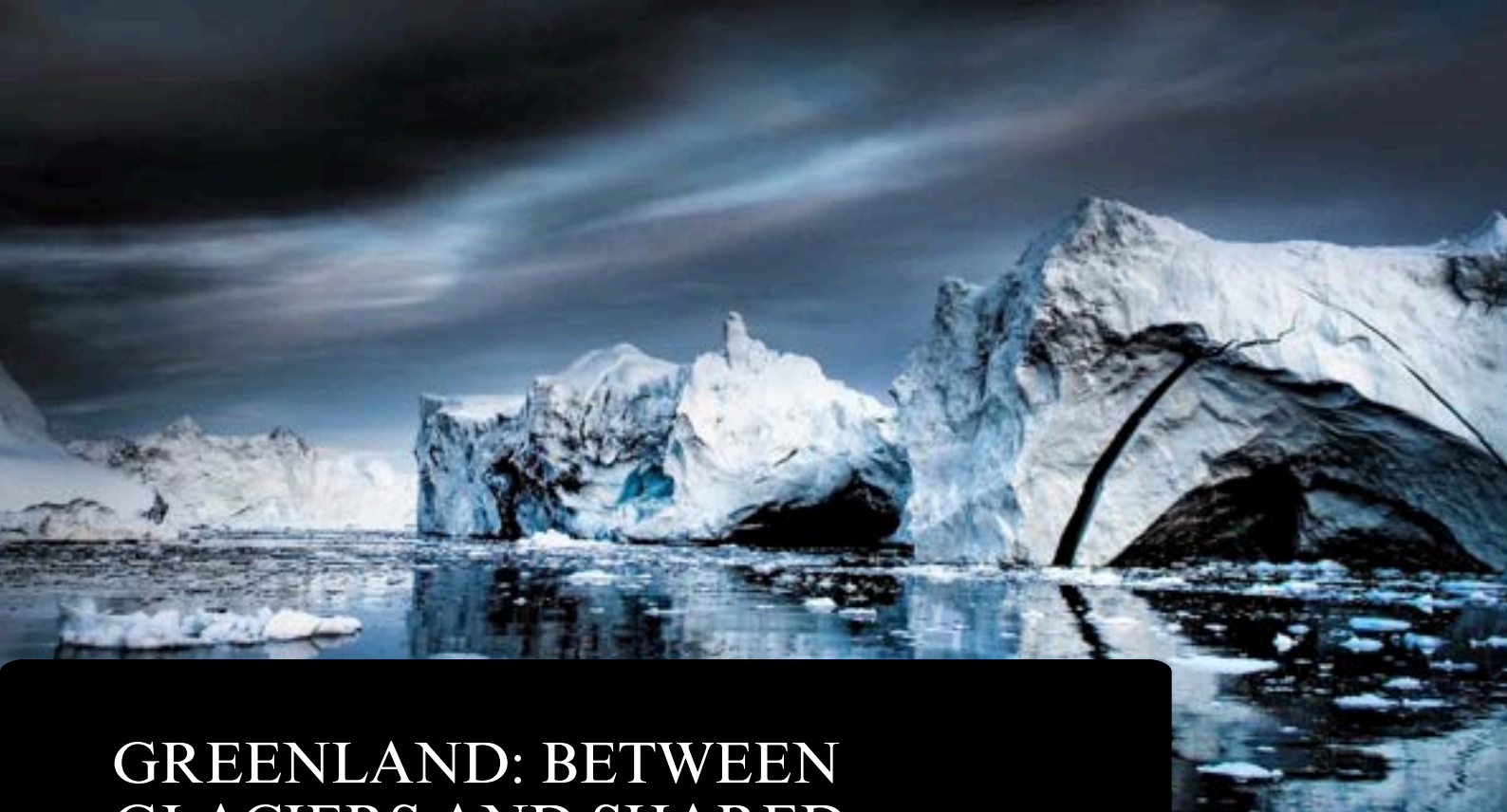
Access is via flights from Reykjavik or Nuuk to Narsarsuaq, a historic airport and a strategic base for exploring the south. The local network allows for travel by sea or helicopter between the main settlements. Hospitality is warm and authentic: small family-run hotels, arctic agritourisms, cultural centers, and lodges immersed in nature. In Qaqortoq, the cultural heart of the south, there are art galleries, craft cooperatives, and spaces for meetings and events. The facilities are ideal for educational groups, cooperative projects, study trips, or artist residencies.

EXPERIENCES THAT INSPIRE AND UNITE

In Kujataa, every experience is a blend of civilization, resilience, and innovation. You can visit UNESCO sites of Norse settlements with local archaeologists, participate in the daily lives of Greenlandic herders, or kayak the agricultural fjords of the south. Workshops can include regenerative Arctic agriculture, local food processing, or landscape storytelling. The Narsaq Museum and the historic sites around Brattahlíð offer unique opportunities for cultural and historical workshops. Experiences foster connection with the land, mutual listening, and a long-term perspective.

THE IDEAL SEASONS FOR EVERY TYPE OF EVENT

- **Spring (May–June):** archaeological visits, educational tours, academic **retreats**, heritage training.
- **Summer (July–August):** green **incentives**, agricultural-cultural **team building**, creative residencies, community **meetings**.
- **Autumn (September–October):** narrative **workshops**, interdisciplinary seminars, food and wine **events**.
- **Winter (November–April):** theoretical training, writing **retreats**, small **conferences**, selected educational groups.



GREENLAND: BETWEEN GLACIERS AND SHARED VISIONS

ITINERARY – INTEGRATED MICE

DAY 1 – NUUK: ARCTIC IDENTITY AND ESSENTIAL ENCOUNTERS

The experience begins in **Nuuk**, the world's northernmost capital, small and vibrant, where Inuit tradition meets contemporary Nordic architecture. The group gathers in a cultural center overlooking the fjord: here the first session unfolds, an intimate and powerful kickoff, accompanied by the scent of hot coffee and a silence brimming with possibility. At sunset, a panoramic dinner featuring local dishes reinterpreted with a gourmet twist sparks the first moment of sharing. The lights of the Northern Lights begin to dance above the frozen sea, a visual blessing at the beginning of the journey.

DAY 2 – ILULISSAT: ICE, DEPTH AND VISION

The day begins with a flight to **Ilulissat**, the "city of icebergs," nestled in a breathtaking landscape. The morning is dedicated to an immersive workshop in a glass-enclosed room overlooking the **Ilulissat Glacier Park**: profound thoughts and broad perspectives merge, like ice and sea. After a lunch of smoked Arctic fish and ancestral flavors, the group sets off on a voyage among giant icebergs: a silent reflection on strength, beauty, and change. The evening concludes with a bonfire in the snow, mulled wine, and Inuit storytelling under the starry sky.

DAY 3 – KANGERLUSSUAQ: WILD TEAM BUILDING AND ANCIENT NATURE

In **Kangerlussuaq**, on the edge of Greenland's interior, the pace changes. In a lodge nestled in the tundra, a team-building activity inspired by resilience takes place: they build arctic shelters, traverse snowy landscapes by snowmobile, and work together to navigate the vast white expanse. Every gesture becomes a symbol of trust, collaboration, and adaptability. After lunch in the hut, the afternoon opens with a facilitated dialogue on change: personal, corporate, and environmental. Dinner, served around a circular table, brings warmth to hearts and sparks new shared visions.

DAY 4 – ICEFJORD CAMP: SILENCE, SPACE, AND LISTENING

The fourth day is a true experiential retreat. In an eco-sustainable camp overlooking the **Icefjord**, the group experiences a day of slow, mindful work. Sessions alternate between moments of individual listening, meditative walks in the snow, and guided reflections. Each participant is invited to write down their own "Arctic vision": a phrase, an image, an intuition. In the evening, a simple, intimate dinner is accompanied only by the crackling of the fireplace and the dim light of the oil lamps: everything slows down, everything settles.

DAY 5 – NUUK: RETURN AND NEW INTERIOR MAPS

We return to **Nuuk** for the final meeting in a traditional house transformed into a creative space. In a circle, each participant shares a word, a thought, or an image to bring into their daily lives. The journey is not just what was experienced, but what changed them inside. The final brunch, served in an Arctic greenhouse with native plants, celebrates life and regeneration. As the plane takes off, Greenland remains imprinted not only on the eyes, but also on the breath: a place that welcomed, challenged, and transformed the team.

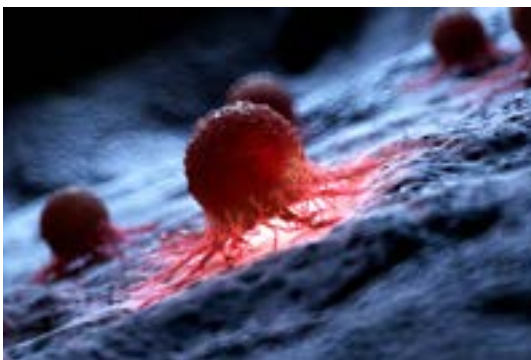
