



CALIFORNIA

IDAHO

Its towns retain a Western spirit. It is possible to admire waterfalls 14 meters higher than those of Niagara and the highest sand dune in North America at 140 meters in height. Also, here is the only park in the United States where you can give a bottle of milk to teddy bears.



UTAH

Lush forests, barren rocky deserts with sandstone arches, rocky pinnacles, mushroom-shaped rocks, a stunning salt flat, small towns with a strong Mormon identity and Indian reservations.



ARIZONA

Western landscapes, canyons with perfectly smooth rocks that follow undulating hypnotic lines and with dinosaur footprints, native Indian reserves with an ancient Indian house literally built on the rock, a desert expanse whose rocks form a rainbow of multiple colors. A state full of naturalistic attractions.

NEW MEXICO

A desert with completely white sand dunes, ancient houses carved into the rock by the natives who populated this area, and high pinnacles exceeding 30 meters in height.





COLORADO

Impressive sand dunes framed by a backdrop of majestic mountain peaks over 4,000 meters high, cave villages within rock niches, snow-capped peaks, mountain lakes, and wildflower expanses, a beautiful amphitheater in the middle of a beautiful esplanade natural, on a protruding red rock conformation where you can listen to live music, rocky pinnacles of clay and sand with the most imaginative shapes and the most varied colors which change continuously according to the light of the day.



WYOMING

Cowboy country, rodeos, dance halls, endless pastures, scenic canyons, a mysterious primitive monument of flat stones arranged in a circle, live country or bluegrass music concerts, majestic geysers, prismatic springs, hot springs, and bears. A state in total contact with nature.

MONTANA

TEXAS

Beaches with numerous sea turtles, a space center, an ancient fortress, the place where President John Fitzgerald Kennedy was assassinated, and an always warm climate.



OKLAHOMA

Prairies, woods, forests, and stories of native Indians. A wild land but at the same time with a friendly and welcoming population.

KANSAS

Vast plains, bison, boundless landscapes, and very peaceful rhythms of life where it is possible to find total relaxation.



NEBRASKA

A boundless expanse of lonely prairies, a 150-foot-tall limestone pillar with a spire, a long trail for bikers and hikers that traverses the northern Nebraska outback for a total of 195 miles that follows an entire abandoned railroad track, a place history linked to a battle between the American army and native Indians and reconstructions of western towns.



SOUTH DAKOTA

An extraordinary mix of history and nature between stories of pioneers, rock sculptures, inscriptions testifying to an ancient past, glacial lakes, corn fields, and infinite horizons.

NORTH DAKOTA

Almost completely flat with a very strong agricultural vocation, large prairies with bison and wild horses, a past of indigenous peoples, and a park with colorful badlands with bizarre rock formations.





LOUISIANA

Homes with high plantations, Creole culture, a marsh, more than 65 different species of reptiles, 250 species of birds, and a large concentration of the characteristic American Bald Eagles. In this state, jazz was born.



ARKANSAS

Breathtaking mountains and views, thermal baths, lakes, numerous art galleries, thoroughbred horse racing, folk music, jazz, rock'n'roll, country and bluegrass, and Victorian mansions.

Bill Clinton, was born in the city of Hope and spent his youth and began his training in Hot Springs. There is also a diamond mine where visitors can dig for diamonds and keep what they find. In addition, there is the longest bridge in North America that can only be traveled on foot or by bicycle and has never been crossed by cars or trucks. Numerous food-themed festivals: peach, tomato, grape, purpleskinned peas and watermelon.

MISSOURI

This state retains a good deal of memory of the authentic Route 66 along a BYWAY marked by signs, historic locations, trading posts, diners, museums, and attractions.

Lewis and Clark set out from here on their epic journey through unknown lands to the Pacific. Fur trappers and fur traders used St. Louis as a supply post before setting out for the Rocky Mountains. Discover the place that inspired Mark Twain and visit his home. The gold diggers left here in search of riches in the West.



IOWA

In the Great Plains region. A state with local crafts and other attractions, such as beautiful handmade quilts, chicken farms, live music, corn on the cob, and frozen lemonade. Here is the crookedest road in the world and this state is the birthplace of Buffalo Bill - the famous American hunter, soldier, and actor who became famous at the end of the 19th century.



MINNESOTA

The State of 10,000 lakes, a tax-free mall for clothing and footwear with 520 shops and sixty restaurants, forests, mountains, and Minneapolis with its fantastic airport is considered one of the best in North America in terms of comfort and availability.

MISSISSIPPI

Places of authentic Southern charm with antebellum mansions, lush botanical gardens, carriage rides, and unrivaled musicians: Elvis Presley was born here.

Tasty local food: fried catfish, scones, crispy fried chicken, greens and cornbread, steak, tamales, boiled and spiced shrimp, shrimp or crab served with the so-called "Comeback Sauce" and relaxing cruises in Mississippi.



TENNESSEE

In this state, more than 1200 venues across the state offer live music every night and there are more than 700 monuments, battlefields, legends, and other signs of the past. Here Elvis Presley recorded his first hits and Martin Luther King was assassinated. The spectacular underground waterfalls are also the tallest in America.



KENTUCKY

Known in particular for bluegrass music, Bourbon (a type of Whiskey originating from the homonymous county), horse racing, underground caves, and the birthplace of Abraham Lincoln.

ILLINOIS

It is part of the Great Lakes region, where Abraham Lincoln began his political career and lived for several years. It's enormous Lake Michigan and the city of Chicago are two very beautiful attractions.





WISCONSIN

It is located between Lake Michigan and Minnesota and has many woods and lakes, but what really makes it famous are: beer, music, and motorcycles. The Miller Brewery, one of the best-known in the United States, can be visited. The Summer Festival offers 11 stages where they play rock music for 9 consecutive days. Do not miss, a visit to the Harley-Davidson Museum will inspire a trip aboard the legendary motorcycle along the roads of Wisconsin.



ALABAMA

In this state, the battle for the civil rights of African Americans began. The coast has white sand beaches and crystal clear water. There is a small recording studio where some of the greatest artists and bands in history have recorded their hits, such as the Rolling Stones, Paul Simon, Bob Seger, Bob Dylan, Lynyrd Skynyrd, and Rod Stewart.

INDIANA

This state hosts, in Indianapolis, the most important car race in the USA, the Indianapolis 500. Other events are the NASCAR Allstate 400, and the motorcycle Grand Prix. It is an agricultural state occupied by vast farms.



GEORGIA

The world's largest collection of Coca-Cola memorabilia, where you can taste up to 70 different products from all over the world and CNN studios are in this state. Also, here Martin Luther King Jr was born and buried and there is also the world headquarters of the famous Delta Airline, majestic oak plantations, and a shoreline with historic buildings, picturesque lighthouses, waterfronts, and natural parks.



OHIO

This state has given the United States seven presidents, which has given it the name of "Mother of Presidents", and is home to Thomas Edison and the Wright brothers, inventors of the airplane. The territory is mainly flat and known to be the state of cows, given the high concentration of cattle farms.

FLORIDA

Coral islands with deep blue seas, swaying palms and mangroves, lively nightlife, swamps with alligators and crocodiles, towns with art galleries, amusement parks, and, of course, Miami: a city full of joy with beaches and dream skyscrapers.



SOUTH CAROLINA

A tourist destination for history and culture but also for nature and hiking. Colonized by the English in the second half of the 17th century, they established large plantations, mainly of cotton. Much appreciated for its large beaches.



NORTH CAROLINA

A land of diversity, culture, history, and beauty. North Carolina is a state with a very varied mountain landscape: from the high peaks that extend east of the Mississippi, to the highest natural sand dune system located in the eastern part of the United States. Here the Wright brothers raised the first powered aircraft.

VIRGINIA

It is filled with historic attractions, such as Mount Vernon, home of the first US President George Washington, Monticello, home of the third US President Thomas Jefferson, and the historic triangle with the site of the first English settlement in the New World, Williamsburgh, and Yorktown, where the American Revolutionary War took place. Also, the first NASA astronauts trained here. Finally, beaches, excursions, programs dedicated to nature, and festivals. In this state, President John Fitzgerald Kennedy is buried.



WEST VIRGINIA

West Virginia has no equal on the East Coast when it comes to rafting. The New River remains the most famous location for rafting but also for relaxing walks in contact with nature.



DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

Famous place for the White House, Pentagon, and monuments but also for Georgetown: narrow streets with picturesque colored houses, alleys full of history, red brick sidewalks, sumptuous nineteenth-century villas, and the typical vitality of a university district.

MARYLAND

Maryland packs history, culture, and a vibrant food and wine scene, with seafood (especially blue crabs) as a specialty thanks to the Chesapeake Bay. It is nicknamed America in miniature because it boasts a bit of everything: both the sea and the mountains, both urban and rural landscapes, historical and modern.





DELAWARE

Also known as The First State because it was the first of the 13 colonies to ratify the United States Constitution in 1787. Famous for its tax-free shopping and its particularly convenient tax regime for companies. It offers its visitors seaside destinations, interesting towns, historical places, and untouched nature reserves.



NEW JERSEY

Hills, forests, farms, villages, well-kept towns, and a long white-sand coast where you can relax. All within easy reach of New York or Philadelphia.

PENNSYLVANIA

Pennsylvania represents the state where the most important events in American history took place. This is the state where America was born. The Declaration of Independence and the American Constitution were ratified and signed in Philadelphia.





NEW YORK

Famous throughout the world for hosting the city of the same name and the famous Niagara Falls, but also numerous lakes in the north and west of the state and many towns. New York City is the engine of the world economy with its suggestive skyscrapers, its frenetic life, elegance, and luxury.



CONNECTICUT

A territory rich in forests and lakes with quiet colonial villages nestled in a rural landscape. Here is the first university in the USA, the house of Mark Twain, and the reconstruction of a colonial village.

RHODE ISLAND

The smallest American State with beautiful nature reserves, beaches, and stately homes of the American aristocracy. In this place, it is possible to see the church where John Fitzgerald Kennedy and Jacqueline Bouvier were married.





MASSACHUSETTS

Rich in cultural attractions, festivals, hobbies, arts, open-air accommodation activities, and natural beauties. Boston is a beautiful city and easy to get around, with a compact structure and an undisputed historical, architectural, and cultural richness linked to British colonialism and subsequent independence. The coastal part of Cape Cod has picturesque villages, the residence where President John Fitzgerald Kennedy spent his summer periods, and wide beaches overlooked by the impetuous Atlantic Ocean.



NEW HAMPSHIRE

Typical New England villages, culturally rich cities, miles of scenic parks and forests, inviting lakes, and pristine rural landscapes.

VERMONT

A scenic countryside, lively small towns, and historic places. 80% of Vermont's land area is made up of forests while 10% is used as grazing land. Fertile valleys where cereal crops, dairy products, fruit, and vegetables are produced. Maple Syrup and Cheddar Cheese are Vermont's world-famous food products. 
MAINE

YUKON

SASKATCHEWAN

MANITOBA

A boundless region full of authentic and wild landscapes, of historical sites witnessing a still throbbing past of the fur trade with its enchanting naturalistic diversity that wisely welcomes the prickly cacti, the suggestive tundra, first-tier metropolis, charming historic settlements, immense prairies, forests and lakes that make the area a small paradise on earth.





NORTWEST TERRITORIES

Remote, wild, sparsely inhabited, and fascinating. The subsoil is saturated with gold, natural gas, and diamonds, the coast washed by the Arctic Ocean is jagged and has magnificent promontories and the lakes are nestled between frozen hills. Also, there are diamond mines open to the public.



NUNAVUT

The largest of the Canadian territories. This Arctic region and its many islets are home to a significant Inuit community. Made up of immense tundra plains, mountains, glaciers, and frozen lakes for a good part of the year, this wilderness is spared from mass tourism. Caribou, polar bears, and walruses cohabit between the snowy lands and the coasts of the pack ice. The capital, Iqaluit, offers many activities and visits. In Nunavut it is also possible to discover the Inuit culture, through hunting and fishing, but also the creation of objects and festive events.

ONTARIO

It contains over a third of Canada's population, concentrated between the financial capital, Toronto, and the nation's capital, Ottawa. Much of its territory is covered by vast expanses of wild and untouched nature, dotted with thousands of lakes, forests, and picturesque villages.



QUEBEC




ENGLAND

Besides the largest town, there are many small, picturesque villages which give you an impression of the rugged traditional way of local life, so you can immerse yourself in it.





STREYMOY

The largest and longest of the Faroe Islands is home to its capital. It has grown from a small trading port to a modern and lively city. Enjoy traditional music and art, try fresh fish and other local specialties at the many different restaurants and bars.






NORTHERN REGION



From lively coastal cities to secluded lighthouses, historic manors and national parks, Finland's coast has it all. With more than 50,000 beautiful islands scattered across the sea, this is the world's largest archipelago, and there are plenty of hidden gems to be discovered.

HELSINKI REGION



The Helsinki region includes the capital city and its metropolitan area, as well as some further-flung towns and cities. Here, nature trails and city life are both never more than a stone's throw away, and the area is overflowing with good food, great design, interesting museums and unique architecture. Visit Helsinki and discover why it's said to be one of the world's most liveable cities!







NORTH EUROPE NETHERLANDS



WHY VISIT

The land and sea borders of this country are with Belgium in the south and with Germany in the east. To the north and west it is bordered by the North Sea. They had a vast colonial empire which, at the time of its greatest expansion (17th century), was the leading world trading power.

Its main morphological characteristic is the flatness of the territory (about half of the territory is less than one meter above sea level).

Particular attractions are the navigable channels, tulip fields and windmills. The great use of the bicycle is famous.







NORTH REGION

This sparsely inhabited region is home to some stunning historical fortifications, lovely cities, great museums and excellent watersports opportunities. Its nature varies from vast heathlands to beautiful lake areas.

SOUTH REGION

The Southern Netherlands is a region quite unlike the rest of the country. In particular, Limburg and North-Brabant, have distinct historical backgrounds, Catholic culture and, in the very south, even the rolling landscape - quite unlike any Dutch stereotype. Also there's Zeeland, the province at the heart of the Dutch efforts to tame the sea. Historically one of the northern provinces, this seaside region has a culture of its own and is famously home to the impressive Delta Works.





WEST REGION

The Western Netherlands is the region that most foreign visitors to the Netherlands attend. Quite frankly, many of them don't even see any other part of the country at all. This region has everything you'd expect from the country and has the most sights and activities. It is the most urbanized area of the country. Amsterdam, The Hague, Rotterdam and Utrecht, the four largest cities of the country, are all in this region. There is an abundance of airports, ports, museums, restaurants and nightlife. However, most of the land is still of a rural nature with the occasional cute village and windmills.

EAST REGION



The Eastern Netherlands is a largely rural and natural part of the Netherlands, dotted with historic cities and charming villages and popular for its scenic landscapes. The forests of the Veluwe, which include one of the oldest national parks in the country, are a major domestic tourism destination.













SOUTH WEST EUROPE SPAIN

WHY VISIT

The land borders of this nation are to the north-east with France (from which it is separated by the chain of the Pyrenees) and Andorra, to the south with the British possession of Gibraltar, to the west with Portugal and, through its exclaves of Ceuta and Melilla, with Morocco. Its maritime borders are the Atlantic Ocean to the north and the Mediterranean Sea to the south.

Its Mediterranean and subtropical climate guarantees mild temperatures all year round. Its population is very lively, cheerful and friendly. Numerous peoples and cultures, such as the Celts, Romans, Phoenicians, Arabs have left an incomparable cultural heritage throughout the country, from thousands of years ago until today.



NORTH WEST - GALICIA

You'll love its landscapes full of green wooded valleys, and its amazing beaches. All along the length of its coastline, bathed by the Cantabrian Sea and the Atlantic Ocean, you'll find areas of spectacular cliffs and charming villages.

NORTH WEST - ASTURIAS

A visit to Asturias gives you the opportunity to remember sensations that are often forgotten, such as the sense of calm as you walk through lush green valleys, walking through grass, the smell of the sea at sunrise or the cool air brushing against your cheeks as you enjoy the views from the stunning natural viewpoints. The region boasts examples of unique Pre-Romanesque art.





NORTH - CANTABRIA

This northern part of Spain is home to various prehistoric caves, its towns and villages contain a wealth of beautiful monuments. You'll also marvel at the spectacular landscapes as the coast of Cantabria offers over 60 beaches with fine white sand.



NORTH - BASQUE COUNTRY

This area of northern Spain boasts some of the best cuisine in the world, beaches in natural surroundings and examples of avant-garde architecture.

NORTH - NAVARRE

A land of traditions, great food, the four seasons, festival atmosphere, historical routes.





NORTH EAST - ARAGON

If you're a culture lover, you'll be able to visit monasteries, castles, the various examples of Mudejar architecture with the UNESCO World Heritage designation, and monuments.

Its natural attractions include such spectacular places as the Ordesa y Monte Perdido National Park and the Pyrenean area.



NORTH EAST - CATALONIA

Spectacular beaches of the Costa Dorada, Costa Barcelona and Costa Brava, its world-class gastronomy, and the works of famous artists such as Gaudí and Dalí all make this region one of Spain's most popular destinations.

NORTH WEST - CASTILE AND LEON

This region has a whole host of places which are well worth visiting, including towns like Avila, Salamanca and Segovia (all three World Heritage Cities) and unique attractions such as an archaeological site, which contains traces of the first settlers in Europe.

If you feel like treating yourself to some truly spectacular scenery, you can choose from any of the nearly 40 protected natural spaces, such as Spain's finest Atlantic forests. For a relaxing walk, why not try the largest open-air golden mine excavated during the period of the Roman Empire?





NORTH CENTRAL - LA RIOJA

This area of Spain has over 500 wineries and is internationally famous for the quality of its wines, a whole host of cultural attractions and some amazing natural attractions such as Mediterranean forests, highmountain areas, lunar landscapes.



CENTRE - COMMUNITY OF MADRID

The city of Madrid is a cultural paradise. It is home to what is known as the Triangle of Art, which contains within a limited area the Prado Museum, the Reina Sofía Art Centre and the Thyssen-Bornesmiza Museum.

You'll also be able to visit such impressive monuments or enjoy what is considered by some to be possibly the most exciting nightlife in Spain, as well as wander in large green spaces. Furthermore, there are cities declared World Heritage Sites, small picturesque towns and charming villages in the mountains.

SOUTH WEST EXTREMADURA

Region of contrasts where you'll be able to visit exceptionally valuable monumental sites and enjoy a whole host of natural landscapes.

Extremadura has three sites which have the UNESCO World Heritage designation. In Mérida, its capital, visitors should not miss exploring its archaeological site.

Another of Extremadura's attractions is its spectacular scenery, wooded pastures and Jerte valley in spring, when the cherry trees are in blossom and the valleys are clothed in a blanket of white.





SOUTH - CASTILLA - LA MANCHA

This is a land famous for its arts and crafts, for the unique monuments to be seen in its towns and cities. Any trip to this area in inland Spain should definitely include a visit to its World Heritage cities, such as Cuenca with its famous Hanging Houses, and Toledo with its cathedral and Alcázar fortress. If you like culture and history, you're bound to enjoy its four Archaeological Parks, some of the oldest examples of rock art in Spain.



EAST - VALENCIAN COMMUNITY

This territory boasts an age-old culture which includes the celebration of numerous popular fiestas in all its towns and villages. Major tourist resorts along its coastline, and it has several large cities, foremost of which is Valencia, with a full range of services, as well as sleepy villages in the interior. From north to south, the Region of Valencia comprises the provinces of Castellón, Valencia and Alicante.

SOUTH REGION-ANDALUSIA

One way to discover the culture of Andalusia is by exploring the sites which have been awarded the UNESCO World Heritage designation. In Granada, you'll see the Alhambra Palace, the Generalife Gardens and the mediaeval Albaicín neighbourhood; in Cordoba, its historic centre with the great Mosque; in Seville, the cathedral, the Alcázar Palace and the Indies Archive; and in Jaén, the monumental sites of Úbeda and Baeza. You'll find a variety of natural landscapes which range from the beaches of the Costa del Sol, Costa de la Luz and Almería to the extensive olive groves of Jaén.



SOUTH EAST - MURCIA

A chain of mountains surrounds the plain which Murcia sits upon, a city of Arab origin whose existence is closely linked to the fertile lands around the river Segura. From among its streets of guilds emerges the tower of the Cathedral, one of the symbols of the city, and parts of the Moorish city wall can also still be seen in different parts of the historic quarter.

One of the main tourist attractions in Murcia is the coast, known as the Costa Cálida.



SOUTH - CEUTA

On a bay, the fortified city of Ceuta has been a lookout for the Strait of Gibraltar since ancient times. The walled enclosure presides over the old town of this cosmopolitan Mediterranean city. Since ancient times, the strategic location of Ceuta has attracted different civilizations. Phoenicians, Greeks, Carthaginians, Romans, Visigoths, and later Arabs and Portuguese occupied the city for commercial or military purposes; it eventually chose to become a part of Spain.

SOUTH - MELILLA

A city of Phoenician origin, for centuries Melilla has been an important trading port and defensive bastion in the Mediterranean. The early Old Town contrasts with the rest of the city, which has an important group of Modernist buildings. The Phoenicians established themselves on Melilla's current site in the 7th century B. C. Rusadir, as the city was known, became a flourishing trading port. Centuries later, when a Roman colony, it came to be an important communications centre. Melilla reached its most splendid age with the Arabs, as a trading and defensive city. In 1497, it passed into Spanish hands. Melilla has magnificent wide beaches of fine sand on its coast, as well as the spectacular "Puerto XXI" marina.



SOUTH - CANARY ISLANDS

These islands are known for being the sunshine centre of Europe and offer mild temperatures and a range of outstanding natural attractions. In fact, five of its seven islands have been declared a Biosphere Reserve, and the archipelago has four national parks. Its beaches are its most outstanding attractions, and are perfect for relaxing in the sun or enjoying water sports such as windsurfing and scuba diving. In the interior you'll find amazing landscapes which are ideal for hiking.













SOUTH WEST EUROPE PORTUGAL

WHY VISIT

This country borders only with Spain and its coasts are on the Atlantic Ocean. Its geographical position has allowed it in the past to exercise a vast colonial domain. The climate is warm.

The cities are famous for their beautiful palaces and monuments in a style that mixes Gothic and Renaissance, with azulejos, the typical tiles with which the palaces are decorated.

The icy turquoise water of the ocean alternates with soaring cliffs and jaw-dropping sea caves with enchanting beaches.



NORTH

It was in Porto and in the northern part that Portugal was founded in the 12th century and the Portuguese became a people and a nation.

Porto, a World Heritage city, is the gateway and departure point for a journey across the natural and cultural diversity of the region. It is known for the Port wine, which is shipped all over the world, but also for a heritage which combines ancient churches, monuments and modern buildings.

An area of mountains, natural parks, castles, shrines and churches with Baroque architecture of Northern Portugal with stone and gilded carvings side by side with rural chapels. Cities which retain a human scale with local customs and traditions.

CENTRE

In the interior of the country, there are mountains and villages of granite and schist. By the sea, fishing villages and cosmopolitan beaches with water sports set the pace of the day, and everywhere, centuries-old heritage proudly displays the history of the region.



SOUTH - ALENTEJO

The plains extend as far as the eye. In the north, the pace is set by the green of the flatlands. In the south, the landscape combines with the sun, the heat and a slower pace of life. In the vast interior, unending flatness, and fields of wheat waving in the wind and on the coast, wild, beautiful beaches with small sheltered coves between the cliffs. The vastness of the landscape is dotted with cork oaks and olive trees. Around the hills, low, whitewashed houses stand on small knolls, castles evoke battles and conquests and the yards and gardens are witness to the Arab influences which shaped the people.



SOUTH - ALGARVE

It was here that, in the 15th century, the Portuguese set off on the epic journey that led them to discover other peoples and cultures. The climate is mild and sunny all year round!

There's no shortage of high quality beaches either. Sandy stretches as far as the eye can see framed by golden cliffs, virtually deserted islands marking the boundary between Ria Formosa and the sea, and small coves sheltered by the rocks. The ocean, in every shade of blue and mostly calm and warm, invites you for long swims and to indulge in water sports. To relax, you can have various treatments in the spas and thalassotherapy centres.

WEST - LISBOA REGION

Lisbon is Portugal's capital and the hub of a multifaceted area that appeals to different tastes and senses. In a city that has been influenced by many different far-off cultures over time, there is still a village feel in each historic neighbourhood. Stroll through the Pombaline grid of streets in the Baixa district that opens on to the Tagus in Praça do Comércio, then follow the river to discover some of the city's most beautiful parts: the monumental area of Belém with its World Heritage monuments, the mediaeval quarters and the latest contemporary leisure spaces, such as the Parque das Nações. The wide variety of landscapes and heritage is always close by, whether to the north or south of the capital with beaches, natural parks, cultural routes.



AZORES ISLANDS

Beaches of warm white, vineyards, lagoons, hot thermal waters, volcanic craters covered by lakes, waterfalls, whale and dolphin watching, hydrangeas, windmills, lush vegetation, traditional villages and towns with buildings with a contrast of colors between their white walls and their black basalt, houses with dark stone walls and wrought iron balconies. Nine islands, nine small worlds in the blue immensity of the Atlantic Ocean that have as many similarities as differences.

MADEIRA ARCHIPELAGO



Located in the middle of the Atlantic, the islands of Madeira and Porto Santo are a haven of natural beauty. The exotic colors of the flowers stand out from among the blue sea and the emerald green vegetation. This is an archipelago where two thirds are a protected area and where the largest Laurisilva forest in the world is located. The springtime temperature felt all year round allows for a multitude of open air activities.







SOUTH EUROPE ITALY





WHY VISIT

Its land borders are from west to east, with France, Switzerland, Austria and Slovenia. The peninsula extends into the Mediterranean Sea and is surrounded by the Ligurian, Tyrrhenian, Ionian and Adriatic seas.

It has countless tourist attractions, such as glorious gardens, historic villages and towns, emerald lakes, opera, extraordinary and varied food and drink, fashion, the architecture of broad and varied churches and and monasteries. Roman Etruscan monuments. Renaissance palaces and squares, museums and galleries. Finally, beautiful beaches, sea and islands.



NORTH

Many of Italy's most famous destinations are in the northern portion of the country: historic cities, picturesque villages, charming lakes, the Alps and the Dolomites. 
GREEK ARCHIPELAGOS

WHY VISIT



EAST - THE RED SEA REGION



Island state of 115 islands in the Indian Ocean.




EAST - DEAD SEA

The city of Chichibu is home to the 34 Buddhist temples of the Kannon Pilgrimage. Finally, near the Kinsho temple, there are the Iwadatami rock formations lining the Arakawa River.

An atmosphere of the Edo historical period can still be found in the ancient cities.



GUNMA PREFECTURE

Mountainous landlocked prefecture on Japan's Honshu Island. It's known for its hot springs and ski areas. The small town of Kusatsu has more than 100 hot springs, most famously Yubatake, a large pool fed by steaming mineral water gushing down a wooden chute. Set 1200 meters above sea level, Kusatsu also has skiing and hiking trails. Also there are beautiful lakes and rivers.

TOCHIGI PREFECTURE

It is located north of Tokyo and encompasses part of Nikko National Park. The cedar-filled park contains volcanic Mt. Nantai and the adjacent Lake Chūzenji, formed when the mountains erupted. At the lake's east end are the picturesque, 97-meter Kegon Falls. The city of Nikko, in western Tochigi, is home to Tōshō-gū, an elaborate gold-encrusted shrine honoring the first shogun military dictator and, finally, in this territory there are thermal springs, lakes and mountains.





IBARAKI PREFECTURE

Ibaraki is a Japanese prefecture bordering the Pacific Ocean northeast of Tokyo. The capital city, Mito, in the prefecture's center, is known for Kairakuen Park, where myriad plum trees bloom in late February and March with very vivid colors. West of Mito, the city of Kasama is famed for its Inari shrine, decorated with sculptures of flowers and dragons. Southwest of Kasama, the dual peaks of Mount Tsukuba offer hiking trails. It is possible to admire the splendid views of the Pacific Ocean at Hitachi Seaside Park and there is also Tsukuba Science City: Japan's space agency.

CHIBA PREFECTURE



Chiba is a Japanese prefecture encompassing Tokyo's eastern outskirts and the rural Bōsō Peninsula. In the town of Narita is the 10th-century Naritasan Shinshō-ji Temple, a notable Buddhist site. Tokyo Disney Resort, in the city of Urayasu, encompasses multiple theme parks, hotels and a shopping complex. Chiba's northeastern Kujūkuri Beach stretches some 60 km along the Pacific.







OCEANIA AUSTRALIA

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY



Breathtaking landscapes, from sheer mountains to valleys and plateaus, these islands are famous for their agricultural activities. Each island has several archaeological remains, testifying to a well-organized pre-European community of rich cultural and religious practices.

The cliffs and caves are places of legends. These areas were old graveyards, but are now a place to watch humpback whales frolic in the waters just offshore. Whales come to the Austral Islands from August to October each year to give birth.

Visit colorful and picturesque villages to discover the work of the islanders who live mainly from their works of art. Plus, enjoy watching fishermen, farmers, and basket weavers at work.


GAMBIER ARCHIPELAGO



The remote Gambier Islands are located just over 1,000 miles southeast of Tahiti. Though once the center of Catholicism in Polynesia, the people of Mangareva have reverted to a more traditional Polynesian way of life, and the island has become an important source of supplies for Tahiti's cultured pearl industry.

The lagoon, which houses the entire archipelago, is probably the most beautiful of the islands of Tahiti. Transparent and sandy, turquoise and dotted with coral heads, it displays a range of blues that contrast beautifully with the surrounding lush mountains. As the cradle of Catholicism in Polynesia, Gambier features hundreds of religious buildings built by missionaries and islanders between 1840 and 1870. These include churches, presbyteries, convents, schools and observation towers. Some of them are remarkably preserved while others are in ruins.

MARQUESAS ARCHIPELAGO



The Marquesas are located 932 miles northeast of Tahiti and spread out over 12 islands, of which only six are inhabited. Framed by looming cliffs, the coasts of the Marquesas Islands are a mix of black sand beaches and gorgeous bays. In the lush rainforest, where thousands of pre-European remnants lie, you'll discover wild horses and goats. Local handicrafts consist of large and fine carvings and surprising pieces of jewelry. Giant banyan trees, breadfruit trees, coconut and papaya trees and vertiginous volcanic peaks and amazing slopes blend with the blue of the Pacific Ocean.

In 1901, Paul Gauguin and later in 1975, Jacques Brel, both came to Hiva Oa in quest of what could be referred to as personal inner peace. Walking these same artistic footsteps includes visiting their graves at the Calvaire cemetery, the replica of Gaugin's Maison du Jouir and the small museum dedicated to the painter and his house, where you can see some of his most famous artwork concerning the islanders' everyday life, but also legends and old religious traditions.

TUAMOTU ARCHIPELAGO



Featuring amazing pink sand beaches lined with swaying coconut palms, a crystal clear ocean that's warm to the touch.

This area is also the cradle of the legendary Tahitian cultured pearl. Here the pearls get their unmatched colors and shades. Paradise islands.

SOCIETY ARCHIPELAGO



The archipelago is believed to have been named after Captain James Cook on his first voyage in 1769. Among the many islands, three are particularly famous:

Tahiti, the largest island in French Polynesia, has a mountainous interior adorned with mystical valleys, clear streams and soaring waterfalls.





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
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
